# What you will need:

**RED HEART® Soft®:** 3 balls 9263 Cinnabar

Susan Bates\* Circular Knitting Needles: 5.5mm [US 9] 32" [81 cm] or longer

Removable stitch marker Yarn needle

**GAUGE:** 26 sts = 4" [10 cm]; 21 rows = 4" [10 cm] in Bramble st.

**Note:** Each Bramble = \%" [2.25 cm] wide and the 4 row Bramble repeat = 1\%"

[3.37 cm] high.

CHECK YOUR GAUGE. Use any size needles to obtain the gauge.

# Fall Berries Shawl

This shawl's textured stitch is perfect for keeping the chill in the air out. Wear it all autumn long, and wrap it close as the winter's frost sets in, it's sure to become a favorite.

**SHOP KIT** 

Shawl measures 63" [160 cm] wide x 23" [58.5 cm] deep

#### **SPECIAL STITCHES**

**kfb (Knit into front and back) =** Knit next st but do not remove from needle, knit into back loop of same st and remove from needle - 1 st inc.

kfbf (Knit into front, back and front)

= Knit next st but do not remove from needle, knit into back loop of same st and then into the front of the same st again; remove from needle - 2 sts inc.

#### NOTES

Slip stitches purlwise. A circular needle is used to accommodate large number of stitches; do not join.

# STITCH PATTERN

Bramble St (multiple of 4 sts)

Row 1 (Right Side): \*(K1, p1, k1) all in the same stitch, p3tog; repeat from \* across.

Row 2 (Wrong Side): Purl.

**Row 3:** \*P3tog, (k1, p1, k1) all in the same stitch; repeat from \* across.

Row 4: Purl.

Repeat Rows 1-4 for Bramble St.

### **SHAWL**

Cast on 1 stitch.

# **Set-up Section**

Row 1 (Right Side): Kfbf - 3 sts.
Rows 2, 4, and 6 (Wrong Side): Purl.

Row 3: Slip 1, kfb, knit to end - 4 sts.

Row 5: Repeat Row 3 - 5 sts.

Row 7: Repeat Row 3 - 6 sts.

Row 8: Purl.

#### **Bramble St Section**

Row 1 (Right Side): SI 1, kfb, place marker, (knit, purl, knit) into next stitch, p3tog - 1 st inc.

Row 2 and all following Wrong Side

rows: Purl.

**Row 3:** SI 1, kfb, knit to marker, slip marker, p3tog, (knit, purl, knit) into next stitch - 1 st inc.

**Row 5:** SI 1, kfb, knit to marker, slip marker, (knit, purl, knit) into next stitch, p3tog - 1 st inc.

Row 7: Repeat Row 3 - 1 st inc.

Row 9: Repeat Row 5 - 1 st inc.

Row 11: SI 1, kfb, k1, remove marker and replace after these 4 sts, slip marker, [p3tog, (knit, purl, knit) into next stitch] to end of row – 1 st inc.

Rows 13 and 17: SI 1, kfb, knit to marker, slip marker, [(knit, purl, knit) into next stitch, p3tog] to end of row – 1 st inc.

Row 15: SI 1, kfb, knit to marker, slip marker, [p3tog, (knit, purl, knit) into next stitch] to end of row – 1 st inc.

Row 18: Purl.

Repeat Rows 11-18, 33 times or until shawl is desired size. Work Row 11, once more.

Bind off all sts.

#### **OPTIONAL TASSELS** (make 3)

Cut one 12" [30.5 cm] and twenty-five 8" [10 cm] strands of yarn.

Put all 8" strands together and tie in center with the 12" strand. Fold 8" strands down over tie and tie again, with 12" strand, about 1" [2.5 cm] down from fold.

Trim tassel if necessary.

**Finishing**Sew a tassel to each point of the shawl. Weave in all ends. Wet block to measurements.

# **ABBREVIATIONS**

cm = centimeters; K = knit; mm = millimeters; **P** = purl; **p3tog** = purl 3 sts together; **st(s)** = stitch(es); **YO** = yarn over needle; \* = repeat whatever follows the \* as indicated.
